her, they realized she had given birth to one stillborn kitten and was having complications birthing her other kittens.

We rushed her to Arrow-head Ani-mal Clinic.

where they performed an emergency C-section. One kitten wasn't breathing on its own, so a vet tech quickly went to work helping it breathe, while the vet delivered the last kitten. Both kittens and Fiona survived, thanks to the amazing vet team!

Fiona not only was a wonderful mom to her own kittens but also became a surrogate for two other litters of kittens (a total of 6) who had lost their moms. She treated these orphaned kittens as her own and



saved staff from many sleepless nights of bottlefeeding. Fiona watched all her babies grow up and most got adopted as she waited for her day to come.

On October 23, Fiona got to celebrate her adoption! Her new dad says she is doing great in her new home that she also shares with two dogs. She makes sure to give her dad plenty of love. We are so happy Fiona got her happily ever after!

Keep Pets Safe During the Holidays

With the holidays fast approaching, many pet owners don't realize the dangers that could impact their pet's health. Taking the time to ensure hazardous items are out of reach could make the holidays a lot easier for your fourlegged friends.

Everyone loves presents. and dogs are no different. Making sure that your dog can't get into those presents is important. Dogs have

a great sense of smell and won't hesitate to destroy presents if they smell food inside. Ingesting bows or other items could lead to blockage and require a trip to the emergency room.

Snow globes are a staple for holiday decorating. Did you know that those pretty globes are filled with ethylene glycol, a sweetsmelling chemical? That chemical is highly toxic to animals, so keeping those globes out of reach can keep your pet safe.

During the holidays, your home may see an increase in visitors. Some of those may be on medica-

> tion, which can be harmful to your pet. Dogs and cats love to investigate suitcases, bags, and purses. Make sure all **medications** are in a safe spot and out of reach.

Items such as homemade play dough and salt-dough ornaments (even when dry) can be very danger your animals if ingested. Make sure those ornaments are up high on the tree and play dough is stored properly after use.

those icy days, be sure to get pet safe ice melt and clean your pet's paws off when they come back into the house.

Some holiday plants can also pose a hazard to your pets. Poinsettias and tree preservatives for real Christmas trees can be harmful. Keep plants out of reach and consider putting the tree in a spot where your animals can't reach it.

One of the best parts during the holidays is gathering around the dinner table. Inform your family and friends not to give out table scraps, as some may be harmful. Bones from turkeys, chocolate, fruitcake, and alcohol are all examples of food pets can't have.

If you think your pet may have eaten something they should not have, call your veterinarian immediately. If your pet may have ingested anything toxic, the ASPCA Animal Poison Control Center is available When salting your walkways on 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. 
